Alternative questions addendum

- Alternative questions do not allow high negation in C (Han & Romero).
- (1) a. Did John **not** drink coffee *or* tea?

√PolarQ, √AltQ

b. **Didn't** John drink coffee *or* tea?

√PolarQ, *AltQ

Recall that apparent disjunctions of polar questions also behave like alternative questions:¹

- (2) Did John drink coffee *or* did he drink tea?
- (3) An interesting asymmetry?
 - a. Pidn't John drink coffee or did he drink tea?

but what does this mean?

- b. * Did John drink coffee or **didn't** he drink tea?
- c. * Didn't John drink coffee or didn't he drink tea?

I forgot whether John, drank coffee or whether John/he, drank tea.

(4) A subject contrast?

- a. ?? I forgot whether John $_i$ drank coffee or he $_i$ drank tea.
- b. $^{?}$ I forgot whether John_i drank coffee or John drank tea.

(5) More negation data:

- a. * Didn't Penelope embarass or insult Peter?
- b. Did Penelope **not** embarass or insult Peter?
- c. <> Did Penelope not embarass Peter or insult him?
- d. <> Did Penelope not embarass Peter or not insult him?

(6) More intervention data:

- a. * Did only Penelope give John a RAISE or a PRESENT?
- b. Penelope only gave John one (nice) thing... Did Penelope only give John a RAISE or a PRESENT?
- c. Penelope only gave JOHN something nice...
 Did Penelope only give JOHN a raise or a present?
- d. Did Penelope give only JOHN a raise or a present?

¹As noted by Henrison in class last time, chracteristic AltQ prosody may still be required.
